

MINEC is present at Filven-2021

Ediciones Amalivaca will strengthen environmental and ecosocialist thinking in Venezuela



This Monday the re-launch of Ediciones Amalivaca was carried out in Caracas, with the aim of strengthening the pedagogical fact in environmental and ecosocialist thinking promoted by Commander Hugo Chávez, highlighted the Minister of Popular Power for Ecosocialism, Josué Lorca.

He also indicated that 21 new titles were presented in environmental and eco-social matters, which may be enjoyed by users at the International Book Fair (Filven-2021); "We are

very happy, we are very grateful for the presence of the entire team of the Ministry of Popular Power for Culture, making a strategic alliance to promote ecosocialist thinking in Venezuela."

Likewise, he announced the opening of the photographic contest "Venezuela an Ecosocialist Look", which promotes Venezuelan training in environmental matters.

He explained that the contest rules will be available on the MINEC website; "All the instruc-

tions, all the indications and the awards of this contest so that each and every Venezuelans can participate in an open way."

The activity was attended by the Minister of Popular Power for Culture, Ernesto Villegas, who together with Minister Lorca, extended the invitation to all Venezuelans to participate in Filven-2021 that will take place from November 4 to 14 in the facilities of the Federal Legislative Palace.

Management balance September 2021

A total of 141,129 plants for reforestation were produced in community nurseries in September

Last Thursday, within the framework of the presentation before the Vice Presidency of the Republic and the Vice Presidency of Public Works and Services of the MINEC management balance for September 2021, the Minister of Popular Power for Ecosocialism, Josué Lorca, announced that A total of 141,129 plants were produced for reforestation as part of the productive alliances implemented together with the Organized Popular Power; among other advances obtained during the mentioned month.

Likewise, the person in charge of the portfolio for Ecosocialism, explained that, in the same period of time, nine Community Nurseries were inaugurated throughout the national territory with an annual productive capacity of 136,000 plants, which will benefit 92,342 people with plants ornamental, forest, fruit, medicinal and horticultural. Minister Lorca also pointed out that, during said month, the Guardianes del Árbol (Tree Guardians) program was launched, a training school for the defense, awareness, protection and respect of Mother Earth and life in all its expressions, with which 1,663 volunteers of all ages were formed, highlighting the participation of a large group of girls, boys and adolescents.

All the advances in environmental matters are framed in the fifth objective of the Plan for the Homeland, "the preservation of life on the planet and the salvation of the human species," reiterated Minister Lorca. Who also added that, in order to strengthen the Forest Engine, alliances were established with 12

Finally, the Minister for Ecosocialism declared that 252 inspections were carried out to prevent illicit and environmental crimes, and added that 248 complaints were received through the 0800-Ambiente telephone line.

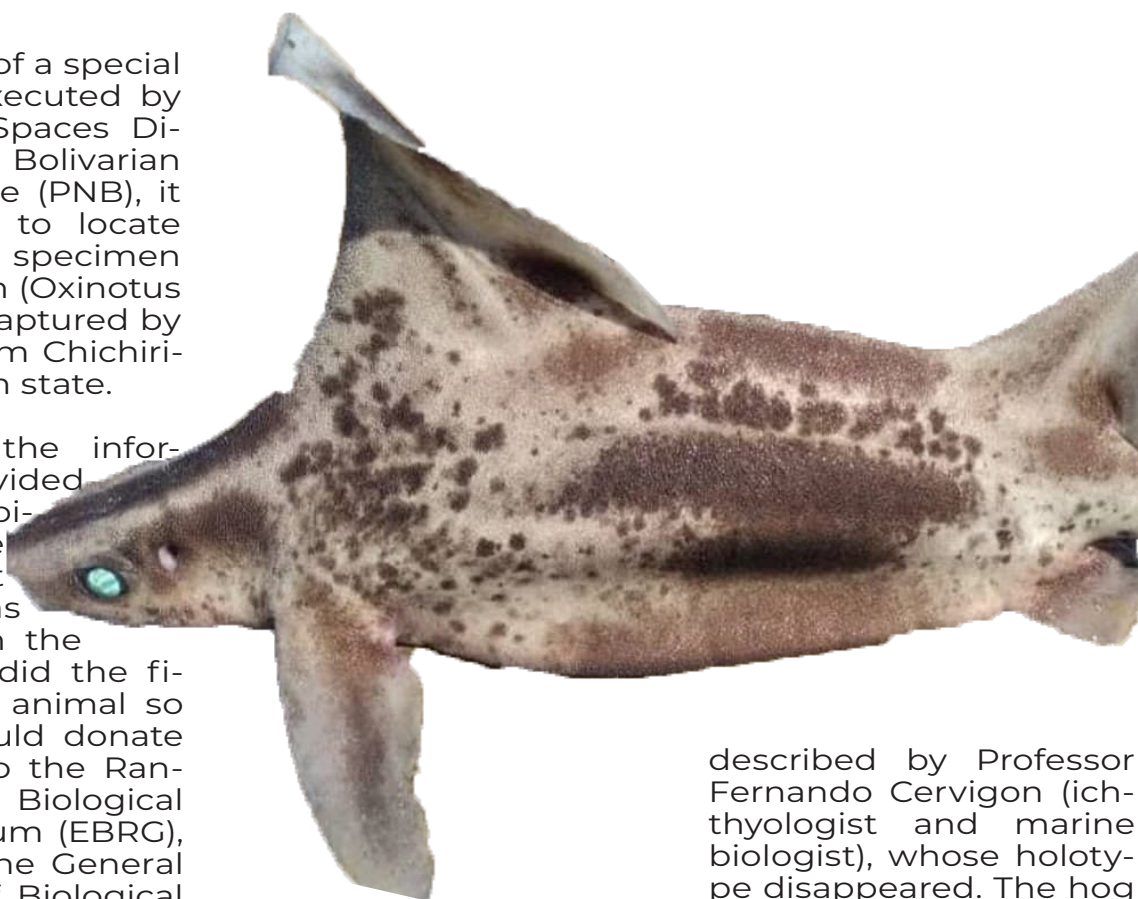

Minec will protect a specimen of Hog Dogfish rescued in Falcón

By means of a special device executed by the Aquatic Spaces Division of the Bolivarian National Police (PNB), it was possible to locate and rescue a specimen of hog dogfish (*Oxinoxotus Caribaeaus*), captured by fishermen from Chichiriviche in Falcón state.

Thanks to the information provided by the inhabitants of the area, a direct approach was achieved with the citizens who did the fishing for the animal so that they would donate the species to the Rancho Grande Biological Station Museum (EBRG), attached to the General Directorate of Biological Diversity of MINEC.

The first and only report of this specimen, to date, was made in Margarita in 1961 and was



described by Professor Fernando Cervigon (ichthyologist and marine biologist), whose holotype disappeared. The hog dogfish (*Oxinoxotus Caribaeaus*), is an endemic species of Venezuela and not known in other parts of the world.



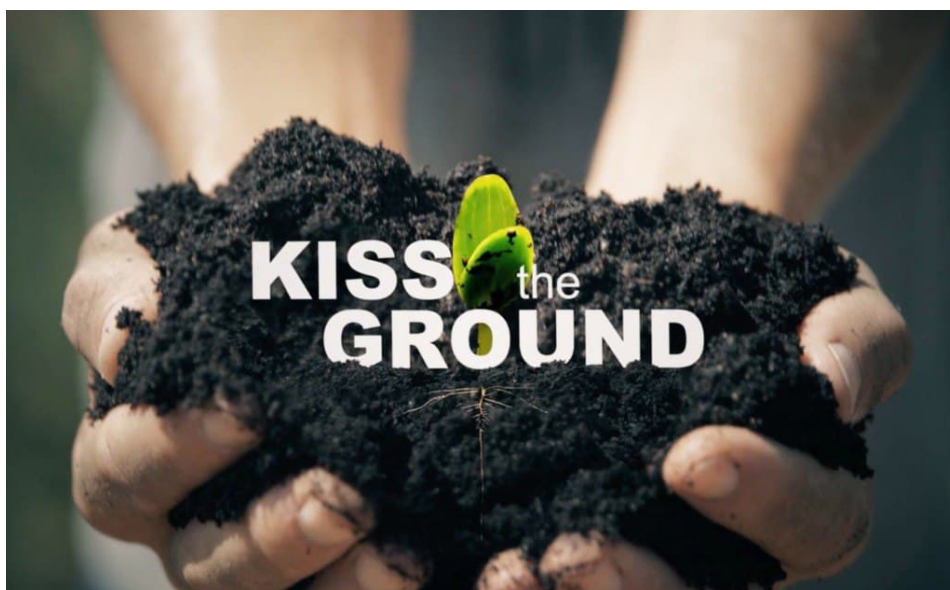

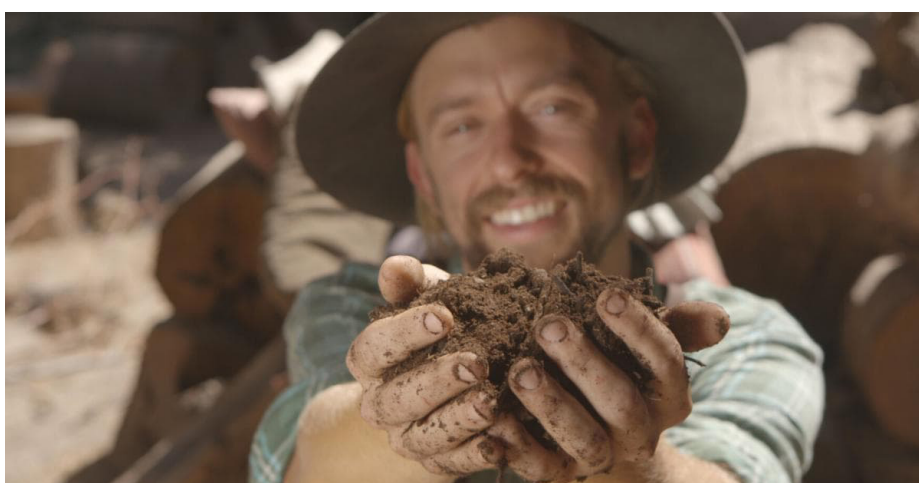
It also tells us about the importance of water micro-cycles, which are carried out by large vegetation blankets through transpiration, which increases the humidity of the environment and produces 40% of the rainfall on the continent. Damaging the soil interrupts these cycles, as it no longer allows vegetation to grow on it and this reduces rainfall.

Kiss the Ground is also a comprehensi-



ve social and multimedia project, which supports farmers to move towards regenerative agriculture and trains "soil defenders" to promote this initiative around the world. Their website is a true online educational center, where you can find from training texts to resources for teaching at school. Everything there is to know to recover the ecology of

soils and contribute to this global task. You can also find conversations with the protagonists of these stories and material of interest on their YouTube channel.
