

Minister Lorca highlighted the environmental conservation programs in the country

Venezuela increased its protected areas from 22 to 30%

The Minister of Popular Power for Ecosocialism, Josué Lorca, reported that Venezuela increased its protected areas from 22 to 30%, thus fulfilling one of the goals approved in 2010 at the X Meeting of the Conference of the Parties to the Convention on Diversity Biological.

Minister Lorca, who participated via video conference in the XV edition of said meeting held in Kunming (China), said that among the newly created pro-

tected areas, from 2010 to date, is the Caura National Park, as well as seven others, is of "great importance for conservation".

During his speech, Minister Lorca explained that among the progress made in the country in this area, there are programs for the conservation and management of threatened species, such as the Orinoco Cayman and the Arrau Tortoise.

In addition, he pointed out that the nation is implementing

plans to "eradicate invasive species", such as the Xenia coral, "which affects marine diversity and the livelihoods of communities".

Likewise, Lorca exhorted developed countries to "grant resources and increase financing to stop or reverse the loss of diversity and reach the maximum potential end of living in harmony with nature" and also denounced the predatory effects that the system of capitalist production to life on the planet.

They refine strategies to strengthen public services in Miranda

During a meeting between the sector vice-presidency of Public Works and Services together with the Government of Miranda state, actions were verified for the benefit of the people, through the Inspection and Supervision Plan in matters of water, environment, electricity, gas, solid waste, roads, transport and telecommunications.

Regarding water, 55 pumping and distribution stations are being repaired in the capital region, adap-

ting all systems for optimal service in Miranda state, explained the vice president of the area, G / J Néstor Reverol.

Reverol announced the creation of a supervision commission for the maintenance and stability of the Tuy System, as well as the activation of the deep wells and the verification of the Complementary Plan for Water Supply by Cisterns.

For his part, the Minister of Popular Power for Ecosocialism, Josué Lorca, announced

that 10,000 pines will be placed in the basins of the main rivers of the entity, with the aim of strengthening them and preserving the vitality of the area.

In addition to the establishment of the pines, it was agreed to repair the La Enea-El Dique road in the town of El Jarillo, which leads to the Agua Fría reservoir, one of the water reservoirs in the Mirandina region. Likewise, it was agreed to plant 15 thousand trees in the Macarao National Park.

With these improvements, access will be facilitated for technical personnel from the Ministry of Attention to Waters, from the Hydrology of the Capital (Hidrocapital) and the work of inspection and environmental nursery in the upper basin of the El Jarillo river.

Likewise, it was agreed to recover 10 compactors, the sanitation of the "Marín I" sanitary landfill in the Urdaneta municipality and the intervention together with the mayors of several municipalities for cleaning tasks.

For the sustainable management of forests

They deliver adaptations of the forestry industry in Barinas and Portuguesa

The Minister of Popular Power for Ecosocialism, Josué Lorca delivered production certificates to 22 carpentry shops, adaptation to 3 sawmills and 1 innovation factory in the Portuguese state, as part of the strengthening of the Forest Engine instructed by President Nicolás Maduro.

The person in charge of the portfolio for ecosocialism pointed out that "important alliances have been achieved with the producers so that the wood reaches all the states of the country, the communities, the neighborhoods, and thus fulfill the Fifth Objective of the Plan of the Homeland and continue building Ecosocialist Venezuela".

The certifications have the purpose of establishing productive chains, regularizations and updates of the sector, with which the Ministry of Popular Power for Ecosocialism, simplifies and speeds up administrative procedures for exporters, producers, planters, carpenters, sawmills, wood deposits, companies of the coal, pulp, paper and all those of the branch.

Likewise, in the state

of Barinas, 36 Adaptations of Forest Industries were delivered to representatives of logging organizations, an act that was led by the General Director of Forest Heritage of Minec, Walter Chacón, who stressed that the intention is to strengthen the Forest Engine in the entity, to access better conditions for

the sustainable management of the resource.

During the same act in said entity, three thousand 500 coffee and cocoa plants were granted to the small producers of the Cruz Paredes municipality, to be used in the recovery of the Masparro river areas.

Caura National Park

One of the greatest ecosocialist achievements in Venezuela

Venezuela surprises us daily, due to the diversity of its land, we can find majestic mountains, lagoons and deserts, all in the same country, get ready to know the Cura National Park, located in the Bolívar state, a walk through the plateau typical of Guyana region, with foothills and mountains.

In 2017, the Bolivarian Government decreed it the Caura Popular Indigenous National Park, which is why it is considered one of the greatest eco-socialist achievements in the country, it has an area that covers 7.5 million hectares destined to the protection of diversity biological.

Since its creation, it has been recognized by the United Nations Environment Program (UNEP) as the largest protected jungle area in the world.

The space, under the administration of the National Institute of Parks (Inparques), was created to "strengthen an integrated policy of environmental management, and expand the guarantee of protection and recovery of its ecological characteristics, sources of important water courses, reservoir of biodiversity, fragile ecosystems, the presence of indigenous peoples and communities, and the exercise of national sovereignty", states presidential decree No. 2,767, in Official Gazette 41,118, of March 21, 2017.

The Caura National Park encompasses the Sucre, Cedeño and Angostura municipalities of the Bolívar state, as well as Manapiare, of the Amazonas state, where seven indigenous ethnic groups live: Yekwana, Sanema Hoti, Pemón, Hivi (Guajibó), Eñepa and Kariñas. Although

there are also non-indigenous communities made up mainly of migrant populations from other states such as Sucre, Anzoátegui and Monagas.

It covers approximately 20% of the territory of Bolívar state and represents 8.2% of the national territory, which are geo-strategically characterized by being an international border area close to the Orinoco-Apure Axis.

The Caura River represents its main hydrographic basin, which extends over an area of approximately 4,533,600 hectares, making it the third most important river in the country, due to its flow after the Orinoco and Caroní. It is home to a great wealth of biodiversity, home to more than 475 species of birds, 168 species of mammals, 46 species of reptiles and 16 of amphibians.

Morphologically, it has a diversity of landscapes found in the Caura River region that are typical of the Guiana Shield, as a reflection of the multiple geological-geomorphological processes that occurred from the Precambrian to the present. In El Caura, landscapes of the high plateau, foothills, mountains, plateau, hills, peniplanes, plains and valley are modeled.
