Venezuela complies with international agreements against climate change

United Nations Forest inaugurated in Waraira Repano

The Ministry of Popular Power for Ecosocialism inaugurated in the sector the Estribo of the Waraira Repano Park in Caracas, the United Nations Venezuela Forest, with the purpose of commemorating the 76th anniversary of the international instance.

Minister Josué Lorca participated in the activity in the company of the president of the Tree Mission, Wilmer Vásquez and the UN representative in the country, Gianluca Rampolla del Tindaro, who also contributed to the planting of 130 trees of native species.

Minister Lorca indicated that the action is the result of the instructions of President Nicolás Maduro, regarding the rapprochement with all the organizations "that want the well-being for our country, for the Venezuelan homeland."

In addition, he stated that this is a crucial moment for the planet because "there in Glasgow, Scotland, the representatives of the world are meeting, debating on the climate actions that will be taken to reduce the effects of climate change and greenhouse gas emissions".

"From Venezuela, with these small actions, we continue to contribute to climate change adaptation and

mitigation programs, and we continue to give our proposal to the world, which is Ecosocialism, as a new way to save planet Earth and the human species", assured.

For his part, the UN delegate in Venezuelan territory, Gianluca Rampolla del Tindaro, asserted that the place is a small contribution that is generated by the environment and against climate change.

"It is only the beginning of a work that is part of a program run by FAO, which aims to produce some 50,000 native trees". "We committed today not only to produce but to plant in a few months about a thousand trees to help reforestation in this park," said the UN delegate.

Rampolla explained that "today we inaugurate this small United Nations forest, but we go further, because in the work we are doing to plan within the framework of cooperation with Venezuela, we are going to seek spaces for technical contribution within the work on the environment, biodiversity and climate change".

Lorca presented October balance

A total of 156 certificates of Adaptation and Operation of Forest Industries were granted by the Ministry of Popular Power for Ecosocialism, during the month of October, as part of the strategies undertaken by Minister Josué Lorca, with a view to strengthening the Forest Engine.

In the monthly balance, the portfolio for Ecosocialism highlights the relaunch of Editorial Amalivaca, which placed at the International Book Fair of Venezuela 2021 (Filven 2021), 21 titles about environmental education for the population were showed in it.

Also, the first photographic contest "Venezuela Bicentennial An Ecosocialist Look" began, with an interesting environmental theme as the objective to be shown.

As part of the actions

undertaken by the Sectorial Vice Presidency of Public Works and Services, the MINEC applied the repair of 17 compactors, the placement of 121 thousand plants, the delivery of 93 thousand garbage bags, also granted 4 containers and 2,400 brushes, as well as 4 rapid intervention motorcycles for solid waste collection, among other measures.

Additionally, the MINEC intervened in the reopening of the Macanao Peninsula Bridge, in the Laguna de La Restinga National Park, in Nueva Esparta state, where was made repair a 25 meter long and 6 meter deep sinkhole, and 80 tons of asphalt was placed.

Regarding the nursery program, six Community Nurseries were put into operation in a Productive Alliance with the organized Popular Power, with an annual productive capacity of 112 thousand plants that will

benefit 76,848 people.

During the period, 75,989 plants were produced, which will be used in the coming days of reforestation, in addition, 538.53 hectares were recovered in deforested areas throughout the national territory.

A total of 162 sabanero morrocayos and 10 baby crocodile (babas) were returned to their natural habitats, coming from the Las Delicias zoo, in Carabobo state.

Likewise, through the 0800-Ambiente telephone interactions, 276 complaints were followed up with open procedures, for the closure of 115 complaints and requests issued by the Popular Power and other entities. In addition, 204 inspections were carried out to prevent illicit and environmental crimes, and 126 inspections.

In addition, 203 permits and authorizations were issued, related to biological diversity and its components.

To continue with environmental sanitation, 6.5 tons of solid waste were collected, as a result of the rehabilitation and cleaning of beaches, rivers and spas. Amalivaca Editions and the Bicentennial Printing Office strengthen eco-socialist management.

German documentary about Geoengineering presented



Workforce and the general public receive training in environmental matters

As part of the environmental training strategies undertaken by Minister Josué Lorca, this week the documentary about Geoengineering was presented at the facilities of the Ministry of Popular Power for Ecosocialism, for the enjoyment of the general public and the working class.

The audiovisual, produced by the German television station Deutsche Welle (DW), shows a group of engineers and researchers who want to intervene in the geochemical cycles of the earth, since CO₂ emissions are not reduced fast enough to prevent the point of no return.

In this regard, the general director of Training for Ecosocialism and president of the National Foundation for Environmental Education (Fundambiente), Jesús

Méndez, indicated that the film shows "options that countries, companies and researchers are developing in different parts of the world about the decrease in the planet's temperature".

Méndez pointed out that scientists "seek to capture CO₂ and see if it is possible that human projects, as well as research work, can interfere in the accelerated process that our planet is experiencing, in terms of climate change".

"It is a documentary that deeply calls us also to develop our own work and research, from the Bolivarian Republic of Venezuela, that also contribute to the debate and discussion, and to the concrete execution of research work," said Méndez.

91 thousand hectares of natural wonders

Tirgua National Park:

An earthly paradise between Cojedes and Yaracuy



Its geographical location gives it great majesty in the ecosystem

The General Manuel Manrique "Tirgua" National Park is a hidden treasure within the Cojedes state that has much to offer its own and visitors due to its natural wonders.

It is located between the Ezequiel Zamora and Anzoátegui municipalities in the Cojedes region, it also covers the territory of Nirgua, Yaracuy state, it has an area of 91 thousand hectares.

It was declared a National Park on June 5, 1992 during the government of Commander Hugo Chávez, who through the 1999 Constitution promoted the lines for a healthy and ecologically balanced environment, as a fundamental human right, thus protecting the Parks Nationals.

In its interior it houses indigenous hamlets of the area, with a population of just over 3,000 inhabitants in the Cojedes state alone. It is administered and managed by the National Parks Institute (Inparques), an entity attached to the Ministry of Popular Power for Ecosocialism

(MINEC).

Flora and fauna of the place

The recreational space, in addition to having ancient trees and palms that occupy large areas of the understory, also has a diversity of flowers that give great visibility to all the confines of the place, and because it is located in the transition stage of the Andean Cordillera and Cordillera From the coast you can see species of flora and fauna representative of both ecosystems.

You can observe species of mammals such as the araguato monkey, capuchin monkey, cunagueros, limpets, picures, wild pig, armadillo or cachicamo, to name a few of them. In the variety of birds you can see species of hummingbirds, fly traps, raptors, tanagers, parrots, parakeets and in reptile species iguanas, diversity in snakes, among others.

Ancestral and natural places that are worth visiting

It has natural and ancestral beauties dating from many years of creation that were discovered throughout history, such is the case of the Casona Antigua, located in a coffee farm, created in 1616 and is located in the sector Cerro Azul, also Las Ruinas de Tucuragua.

In this earthly paradise is the royal road where the Spaniards used to travel, also the Petroglyphs Area carved by the aborigines, the

Campo Elías farm, courses and waterfalls of 92 meters high, as well as underground waterfalls of up to 42 meters high, galleries and natural acoustic shells, terrain for mountaineering and mountaineering, areas for swimming, works and rocks carved by aborigines.

In the place excursions are carried out, ecotourism, recreation and leisure are practiced, as well as extreme sports, scientific research, camping with and without overnight, hiking, cycling and cultural activities.

There is a museum that is named Don Demetrio Silva, a cultist born and connoisseur of the Tirgua National Park. This archaeological museum exhibits ancient pieces, including those carved by the aborigines, as well as unknown plants, photographic galleries, objects from the War of Independence, the Federal War, remains of unknown and endangered animals, and is open for the visit of Seasons, researchers, students and anyone who wants to enjoy its facilities.
