Venezuela is committed to continue working for the environment

During the meeting commemorating the 40th anniversary of the Forum of Ministers of Environment of Latin America and the Caribbean, the head of Ecosocialism in Venezuela, Josué Lorca, spoke about the realities of the continent, and made available to the attending delegations the experiences Venezuelans on the subject.

The Minister thanked in the plenary for the invitation to the Venezuelan State to the meeting, and pointed out that "we are committed every day more to work for a more sustainable environment".

"We believe that it is necessary to adjust and strengthen the means of financing at the Latin American level and adapt them to our realities", he said.

He added that "geographical borders or those imposed by our states are not so for the environment and the common realities that we have as a continent".

He argued that "this is a space to stand out and call for us to look inward, to review ourselves and perhaps we can come together, beyond political differences, in this global objective that is to save Planet Earth, which is to save us as a human species and also to save all the other species on the planet, and guarantee our subsistence for the next generations".

"I am sure that if we all get rid of the colors and put on the table what are the initiatives that each country of this continent has in terms of the environment,

we can advance much more and we can tell the global financing mechanisms look we are different from Europe, from Asia, because we have bureaucracies specific to each country", he stated.

He assured that "we have different political methods but with common realities and we are very similar, more than we think".

"Venezuela makes some of its initiatives available. We have great strengths in terms of dealing with forest fires, we have a university that specially teaches a degree in forest fires to combat these events. We have made it available to Alba and CELAC to make some trades," he explained.

He pointed out that "we have a university specifically for the environment, with careers in environmental matters. We have programs for the conservation of species and the eradication of invasive species such as the lionfish or the xenia coral, which has now changed its name and threatens the entire Caribbean coast and is a common problem throughout the Caribbean area".

"We make available data, methods, mechanisms, techniques for control," he said.

He commented that "we are proud to say that we own one of the largest hydroelectric plants in the country. 80% of our electricity consumption is clean

energy that comes from hydroelectric plants.

"We also have 43% of the country protected in highly restricted figures such as national parks and natural monuments, which allows us to

have a bit of experience that we make available in terms of training what we call park rangers and in other countries they call rangers. We have more than 20,000 men and women trained in this matter," he asserted.

He also stated that "I want to put our Ministry, our State at the disposal of the entire America to do common work and advance in terms of preserving our ecosystem".

500 young people sworn in this weekend in different acts

Sworn youth brigades against climate change

With a series of events and actions in various sectors of the Venezuelan geography, since last Saturday and for three days, the Ministry of People's Power for Ecosocialism (Minec), will swear in around 500 young people grouped in 20 Youth Brigades against Climate change.

In the central event, which took place in the Botanical Garden of Caracas this Sunday, the head of the Minec, Josué Lorca, who swore some 100 brigadistas from the capital with the aim of contributing to the strengthening of a new eco-socialist culture, in which the people are the protagonist with a view to building an environmental sustainability policy that promotes actions to mitigate the effects of climate change.

Prior to the swearing-in, around one o'clock in the afternoon, the Minister, the invited authorities, the brigade members and the volunteers, participated in a bicycle ride from Plaza Diego Ibarra, which will run along the plaza's bike lane, junction with Bolívar Avenue towards Venezuela Square, to finish in the parking

lot of the Botanical Garden.

It is expected that with the oaths young people become aware, sensitized and at the same time transmit this message to the public about good environmental practices, which seek to counteract the effects of climate change.

As part of the training tuesdays and the film forums with the theme of "Climate change, peoples, planet and life", this tuesday, the General Directorate of Training of the Ministry of People's Power for Ecosocialism (MINEC), promoted a discussion on environmental education.

Waraira Conference Hall Repano , which shares the Minec with the Popular University of the Fruto Vivas Environment (UPAFV), was in charge of the educator Bertha

Carvallo, who recounted her experiences in the area at the level of primary schools.

At the meeting was the general director of Training of Minec and president of the National Foundation for Environmental Education (Fundambiente), Jesús Méndez, who pointed out that the meeting and the theme were held on the occasion of the International Day of Environmental Education this January 26.

Cared for and release a juvenile green turtle in La Guaira

Personnel from the General Directorate of Biological Diversity of the Ministry of People's Power for Ecosocialism (Minec), attended and then released a specimen of green turtle that was located in Playa Grande in the state of La Guaira.

The animal, which is in danger of extinction, was reported by Captain José Alvarado, of the Captaincy of the Playa Grande Yacking Club, and rescued by the sailors of the bay with demonstrations of little capacity for apnea and weakness to neurostimuli.

The Biological Diversity servers of the Ecosocialist Territorial Unit (UTEC) La Guaira and the biologist Giovanna Giandolfi, from the National Center

for Fisheries and Aquaculture Research (Cenipa), evaluated the specimen exhaustively.

They determined that it is a green turtle (Chelonia mydas) female juvenile, 78 by 70.5 centimeters, weighing approximately 15 kilograms.

Through a work table, with the support of the community, they

established that the turtle is part of a group of six individuals that arrives in the vicinity of the club, so, in order to monitor it, they proceeded to release it. in the deepest area of the perimeter.

ICLAM prepares environmental educational services and reforestation plans



This activity is part of the educational learning of the programs in the environmental area

Like every year, public servants from the Institute for the Control and Conservation of the Maracaibo Lake Basin (Iclam), prepare to receive, through guided visits, children, young people and adults at the nursery facilities, located at the main headquarters in Maracaibo.

This action is carried out with the aim of supporting academic processes, and encouraging visitors to have a sense of belonging to plants and nature.

The attention is provided by the staff that is part of the Management of Exchange and Promotion of Ecosocialist Knowledge (Gipse) of the Iclam, and is offered to all public, especially to schools, on

a scheduled basis, to strengthen the environmental educational area. This activity is also part of the educational learning of the various programs framed in the environmental area.

ICLAM facilities are briefly shown, until arriving at the nursery, located at the back of the building, where everything related to plants is explained about their importance, care, variety and ways of propagation. In the same way, those

who participate in the tour have the opportunity to carry out practices on the site, such as: propagate or plant some species.

Environmental educational services

Those interested in requesting environmental educational services, which in addition to guided tours, include: Reforestation plans for schools, educational talks and ecological games, among others, can do so by sending a communication (printed or digital), addressed to Armando Portillo, president of Iclam, requesting the service, or go to the headquarters, located in the Las Banderas Square sector.

It is important to take into account that any educational activity requested from Iclam must be previously coordinated and authorized by the school municipality and the corresponding Educational Zone.

The president of the Tree Mission, Wilmer Vásquez, announced that the "Guardians of the Tree" program will be taken to educational institutions throughout

the country, so that all students have the opportunity to produce it. He also mentioned the development of the Community Nurseries program, in which various supplies are given to the communities for the production of plants of various species.

Likewise, the Sowing Life Program, with which, through joint work between the Ministries of Popular Power for Ecosocialism and that of Attention to Water, as well as community actors, will carry out various activities and conferences to recover hydrographic basins with the launch of the national reforestation strategy in which other Mission programs are immersed.

Likewise, the Ecourbanism Mission, in order to establish thematic forests to encourage social tourism in urban developments, as well as strengthen the agroforestry program.

In the course, which was held in the conference room of the General Directorate of Biological Diversity, at the Minec headquarters in downtown Caracas, knowledge and experiences were exchanged on the strengthening and harmonization of the mechanisms, systems and processes of issuance of electronic permits in Venezuela.
