

Russian diplomatic delegation accompanied the activity

They carry out tree planting day in honor of the victims of World War II

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Minister Lorca and Ambassador Melik reaffirmed the ties that unite the Russian Federation and Venezuela

With the presence of the Minister of Popular Power for Ecosocialism, Josué Lorca, and the ambassador of the Russian Federation, Sergey Melik, 30 trees were planted in an area that has been distinguished as "Garden of Memory", in the Generalissimo Francisco de Miranda Recreational Park, located east of Greater Caracas.

The day was held in honor of the more than 26 million people who died in the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics (USSR), during the so-called "Great Patriotic War" (World War II), in which the Soviet people resisted with great strength. the ravages of German Nazifacism.

With the melody of the Alma

Llanera and the Katyusha song , performed by the violinist Charlis Giuseppe, the musical background served for the unveiling of the corresponding signage, for the purpose of identifying the place and the establishment of the new plants on the site.

In this regard, Minister Lorca stated that he was honored to accompany the attending Russian diplomatic delegation, the members of the Russian movement Volunteers for Victory and the representatives of the graduates from Russia and the Soviet Union.

For his part, the Russian ambassador Sergey Melik considered the event very important because on June 22, 1941 the

"Great Patriotic War began, one of the cruelest and hardest battles of humanity".

"The Soviet people suffered casualties of 27 million human beings, a very high price to guarantee the peace of humanity. Nazism, which came from Hitler's Germany, occupied Europe and started the war against the Soviet Union, which culminated in the great victory of the Soviets and the Allies", the Russian diplomat said.

He added that thanks to the government of the Bolivarian Republic of Venezuela and the Ministry for Ecosocialism (Minec), headed by Josué Lorca, "we are in this beautiful park planting in this Garden of Memory, where we had already planted last year".

flamboyant trees are very pretty, they show a red flower and a star inside, something very symbolic for us because the red star is the victory in the Great Patriotic War, and at the same time the red is a memory of the human blood lost Melik said.

For the Russian representative, the day is one of pain and sorrow for the victims , and at the same time it is a date of remembrance "so that this Nazi ideology never repeats itself".

"We are going to continue our fight paying homage to our ancestors, so that future generations live without this great evil," he said.

Meanwhile, the international coordinator of the Russian Movement Volunteers for Victory, Anael Ruiz, indicated that "the date is marked by an international activity called the Garden of Memory, which includes the placement of trees in all the territories of the world where it is located. the grouping".

"We know that the Soviets, through blood and fire, lost 27 million lives, to give humanity a better world, one of peace and free of fascism", Ruiz assured.

Call for equal treatment of countries in the post-2020 Global Framework for Biological Diversity

The Venezuelan delegation participating in the Fourth Meeting of the Open-ended Working Group on the Post-2020 Global Framework for Biological Diversity, which is being held in the city of Nairobi, the capital of Kenya on the African continent, requests equal treatment for the signatory countries of the agreement.

With this decision, the Venezuelan commission hopes that the position of all developing countries can be made known, with inclusive language, all together by a single government in the world, aimed at applying a rights-based approach humans.

Additionally, the representation of the country indicates that it is committed to the construction of a Global World Framework, under the general objective of "living in harmony with nature", agreed by the governments of the world at the headquarters of the United Na-

tions Organization (UN) in Geneva, Switzerland.

Climate Change is an irreversible process to which we must adapt, and one of the many ways we have to do it is knowing the consequences of the different environmental problems to find solutions and apply them, in order to preserve life on the planet.

The Minec puts into practice the "Training Tuesday" project to instill in the viewers of the documentaries the knowledge of what is happening at a global level with the environmental processes that have arisen as a consequence of the climate crisis.

REFLECTIONS ON ECOSOCIALISM

The communal road to Ecosocialism

In the prologue of that wonderful book that is "The long march towards the Communal State" by Professor Iraida Vargas and Professor Mario Sanoja, Luis Brito wrote:

"Who I am? it is the basic question from which a person or a people are constituted. But the path to knowledge is to transmute the question into Who are we? Nobody is by himself. Our being is formed and transformed in the relationship with others. Our questions only find an answer when we inquire who we were and who we want to be".

This is the point of our central theme, Who do we want to be?: To continue to be a capitalist society that predators Mother Earth, whose production system has led to the global climate crisis that puts our very existence at risk? Or on the contrary we want to be an Ecosocialist society of justice, peace and in harmony with nature.

The issue is sensitive, but hopeful when we observe what is happening in our organizations of People's Power. In them there is a clear tendency to preservation and to repair the

damage done.

The Bolivarian People in the exercise of self-government correctly prioritizes environmental aspects, works and organizes itself accordingly. We are not only talking about Peasant Councils and Communes in rural areas, but also about an important contingent in the

capitalist mode of production cannot be decreed, it must be built, and that construction is already happening within the people.

"A revolution that does not produce a new social space is because it has not been able to realize its full potential, since a social transformation, to be effectively revolutionary in nature, must manifest a creative capacity to act on daily life and consequently on the codes, the language and the cultural forms that help to establish the conditions for the generation of a new social space." (2015, Vargas and Sanoja). It is precisely what a transi-



cities, to which are also added movements or any other form of organization, which list innumerable recovery and preservation activities, establish their natural heritage to protect common spaces and trees, clean up streams and paint murals that contain the word Ecosocialism or any other message that aims to preserve the environment.

The challenge of such a great transition that overcomes the

tion means, it is the construction of new codes, new social relations and these relations will be Ecosocialist to the extent that they are established in harmony with Mother Earth.

The recognition of the Rights of Mother Earth is a first step, as was promoted by our Bolivian brothers and sisters in 2014, with a law. An achievement of Comrade Evo Morales then president, who had the support of the indigenous social



base.

Another important aspect of this transition from the communal is the mode of production against hegemony, supportive and respectful of the environment. Industrialized countries, in order to make protection policies and force capitalist companies to stop damaging the environment, must implement punitive fiscal policies. It is difficult to make understand the urgency of the measures to save the planet, to social groups whose interest is accumulation. In the communal sphere the opposite happens, by its nature the primary productive interest is liberation, independence, sovereignty, therefore, it is much easier to start a productive culture that respects the environment with that contingent of wills.

There is no doubt that our revolutionary process has powerful tools to implement the Ecosocialist transition and the primary champion is People's Power.

From the MINEC we are determined to accumulate a social base of support by promoting the different organizations such as: the Recycling and

Cleaning Technical Tables, Brigades Against Climate Change, the Guardians of the Tree, Ecosocialist Committees of the Communal Councils and supporting the agroecological Communes, these will give accelerated results to the historical transition. To change the capitalist mode of production, it is important to strengthen the missing links in its linear production model. One of the main links has to be recycling, generating a circular economy, a booming industry that will generate significant income for the Communes and movements for the independent multiplication of their projects.

Another link and the most decisive is the organization of

youth, which joins with joy and strength in the work to save the planet with reforestation, we have seen how in recent times thousands of young people have joined from high schools and schools, taking the postulate that Luis Brito García wrote in his aforementioned prologue that no one is by himself, We continue to contribute to the transformation of our generations with a new way of relating to each other and to nature

The road to Ecosocialism is traveled along the communal path, usually and there is nothing more common among us as a civilization than the Pachamama.

I recommend reading the book "Ecosocialism and Commune" by Andrés Barrantes.
