Recycling offers alternatives to communities

They analyze proposals on Recycling Technical Tables-Cleanliness

The Ministry of People's Power for Ecosocialism (Minec) together with the Ministry of Fisheries and Aquaculture (Minpesca), evaluated the proposals with a view to strengthening the Technical Tables for Recycling and Cleaning (Metras), in the coastal zone of Venezuela.

Currently, with the Climate Crisis, the world's attention is focused on the development of policies that allow the cleaning of the oceans, a great defense against global warming and because the seas are great reserves of biodiversity.

In this line, the Minec made available to Minpesca its technical and scientific team, and the Brigades Against Climate Change to deepen cooperation between institutions, in order to promote training and the exchange of ideas related to the preservation of marine biodiversity in Venezuela.

In turn, the Minec will work together with the Popular Power and the Council of Fishermen, Fisherwomen and Aquaculturists (CONPPA) of Minpesca, for the management of garbage and collection of solid waste in the communities of the Venezuelan coastal areas.

In this sense, one of the proposals that emerged was to install a Recycling School, which, according to the Minec autho-

rities, would be a center that not only works with the collection of waste, but also with the transformation of the raw material, to make it a concrete income for the CONPPA.

Likewise, there was talk about community nurseries that facilitate fishermen, fisherwomen and aquaculturists, to cultivate and reproduce plants in the coastal territory. Examples of these plants would be the Coconut Palm, the Beach Grape, the Coconut Tree, the Cují. The Guayacán and the Mangroves, important because they filter sediment and are home to various species of fish, molluscs and crustaceans.

Minec believes in the emer-

gence of a new world and that is why it is committed to negotiating with innovative undertakings, among which we can mention, for example, the delivery of plastic through the Metras system to residences in Parque Central, to repair two elevators in the Mohedano building.

Likewise, Minec recently completely replaced sewage pipes in exchange for 7 tons of plastic. However, the Ministry is aware that recycling is not the definitive solution for garbage, but it is an organizational and entrepreneurial option that can offer concrete alternatives.

Applications begin for the First National Poetry Contest "Life and Planet"



The Ministry of People's Power for Ecosocialism (Minec), through the affiliated entity National Foundation for Environmental Education (Fundambiente) and Editorial Amalivaca, opened the First National Poetry Contest "Life and Planet" to the general public.

All interested parties, whether professionals or amateurs, without age restrictions, residing in the Bolivarian Republic of Venezuela, who have no legal disputes and may do so through original and unpublished compositions, may participate in the call.

With the invitation, it is intended to recognize the work that in this literary genre is developed in the country, with the

proposal of a theme to be developed on natural wonders, fauna, flora and biological diversity, which characterizes the Venezuelan nation in all its territorial extension.

The only theme will be climate change, on which they can send works of the environmental crisis, such as: desertification and droughts, rainfall, floods, loss of the coastal thread and crops, due to high or low temperatures, among others.

Among the aspects to be evaluated are the rhyme, the feeling and the creativity of the poems linked to the proposed subject.

There will be categories for children up to 12 years old, young people up to 25 years

old and adults over 25 years of this age, who will be able to enter the link <http://concurso-depoesia.minec.gob.ve/>, in which they will be able to register their new user, upload the requested information and the contestant's poetry, in Word or PDF format.

The contest began on Thursday, July 7 and will continue until Tuesday, August 2. Between August 03 and 07, the evaluation process of the contestant poems begins and by Wednesday, August 24, as part of the celebration of the International Day of National Parks, the winners will be announced.

A reforestation day was held in the municipality of Sotillo, in the state of Anzoátegui, through the National Program "One Student, One Tree", headed by the director of the Office of the Ministry of People's Power for Ecosocialism (Minec), Radamés Blanco, from the "José Antonio Sotillo" School Group, located in the city of Puerto La Cruz.

During the planting carried out in different parts of the municipality, Blanco was accompanied by the director of the Ecosocialist Territorial Unit (UTEC) Anzoátegui, Mayra Flamenco, in which they highlighted the achievement of having exceeded the goal set in the region, with the establishment of 36,000 trees scattered in the 15 municipalities of the entity.

In addition, the Minec commission also made a donation of 5,000 copies, including seedlings and seeds of different species to schools and high schools in the community, as well as 5,000 polyethylene bags to continue promoting the successful reforestation work in Anzoatiguense lands.

The event was attended by a multitude of students for the work of planting a great variety of species, distributed among forest, fruit and ornamental trees, such as: lemon, mango, manga, tamarind, sour-sop, almond, sugar apple, red tea, as well as trinitarias, crotos de oro and sea foam.

Likewise, public servants from Minec, Misión Tree, Educational Zone, National Institute of Parks (Inparques), Bolivarian Student Organization (OBE) and teachers

participated in the act.

It is worth mentioning that these reforestation actions were replicated in different localities of the national geography, with operations in the states of Monagas, Guárico, Carabobo and Portuguesa, among other entities.

700 new plants for Maturín

In the region of the eastern plains, from the Hato Brasil sector, Maturín de Monagas municipality, 700 specimens were planted with the activation of the programs: "A student, a Tree" and "Family Agroforestry".

Species of almendrón (200), pumalaca (100), mango (150), araguaney (100) and leucaena (150) were placed.

On the day, the students of the Miguel José Sanz National High School established trees together with volunteers from the Minec and affiliated organizations such as the Tree Mission, the National Reforestation Company (Conare), the Educational Zone, along with members of the National Guard Environmental Nursery. Bolivariana (GNB), Guardians of the Tree and Alianza Productiva, among others.

Meanwhile, a similar action was carried out in Guárico, through the placement of 62 plants of forest species in the Arístides Rojas Natural Monument, located in the industrial zone of the city of San

Juan de los Morros.

During the reforestation, high school students from the EU León Toper participated in the plains entity Wortman, articulated with public servants of Minec and its attached entities. Among the established species are Indian naked, pericoco, oak and jabillo.

Similarly, in Portuguesa, progress was made in the National Reforestation Plan with the establishment of 90 plants, supported by the agroforestry work of primary (35) and general secondary (56) stu-

dents from educational institutions UE Plan de la Mesa, UE Mochima, LB Juan Pablo Pérez Alfonzo and LB Barbacoa

In Carabobo, likewise, a repopulation of tree species was carried out in the San Juan de Dios sector of the Güigüe parish, in the Carlos Ávelo municipality, in which there was a deployment of the student community of the high schools: Antonio Ricaurte, Carlos Arvelo, Lino Clemente and Luis Beltrán Prieto Figueroa.

These initiatives are part of the

Strategic Lines of Action of the "Good Government", established by President Nicolás Maduro Moros and promoted by Minister Josué Lorca, in order to recover green areas, beautify spaces and counteract climate change.

Placed 1,860 trees in Sucre

Meanwhile, in Sucre, in the Ayacucho parish, Sucre municipality, Plan de la Mesa del Cerro Matacual sector, 364 people, including 91 students, mobilized to place 1,860 plants for different purposes.

Minec gave a workshop on sustainable gastronomy

In continuation of the policies of the Ministry of People's Power for Ecosocialism (Minec), aimed at imparting knowledge and training to the staff that works in the institution and attached entities, it was presented in the Waraira room Repano, the workshop What is sustainable, sustainable or lasting gastronomy?

During this meeting, topics such as food human rights, food security and sovereignty, as well as food regimes, were emphasized.

The main objective of the induction is to raise awareness among the population and promote enterprises that are inclined towards sustainable gastronomy as a state policy.

Xiomara Cuevas, Defender, Special Delegate in the national territory in environmental matters of the Ombudsman's Office and facilitator of the workshop, expressed that we can all eat tasty, healthy, safe and most importantly ecological, with respect for nature.

He indicated that in some way we can be productive without leaving aside "our traditions, reactivating Venezuela's own gastronomy that has been lost over time, such as 'Plum candy and Jobo candy', made with fruits that are part of our endemic species.

The Ministry of People's Power for Ecosocialism (Minec), offered a first aid course to the personnel who work in the institution.

The induction aimed at training administrative, worker and security personnel, to offer a timely response to adverse events that could occur in the Ministry's facilities.

During the activity, basic first aid actions were explained, such as recognizing and quantifying vital signs, measuring blood pressure with a sphygmomanometer, applying bandages and how to act in certain situations, as well as how to use the first aid equipment and who to go to in case of emergency.

The explanation was made by members of the Forest Firefight-

ers Corps of the National Parks Institute (Inparques), specifically the instructor Argenys Figuera, who is part of the Agency's Community Training and Preparation Office.

Figuera reported that all Ministry staff will attend several courses to be held by the Forest Firefighters Corps, among which is the one on the Use and Management of Fire Extinguishers, Fire Preparedness and Eviction Drills for Earthquakes.

The idea of the meeting at the basic level was to train workers in primary care. Soon, an intermediate course on the subject will be taught.
