## Optimize public services in Nueva Esparta

**I**n the state of Nueva Esparta, the Sectoral Vice Presidency of Public Works and Services fulfilled a work agenda as part of the 1x10 system of Good Government.

In this sense, the sectoral vice president of Public Works and Services, G/J Néstor Reverol, explained that "with a third of the executive cabinet, the mayors of the 11 municipalities of the state of Nueva Esparta and the organized communities, we assume the commitments and the challenges in this new way of governing that the President of the Republic, Nicolás Maduro, has ordered to attend to the needs of the people."

He stressed that thanks to the map of solutions and through the social cartography that the organized People's Power has, together with the National Government and local authorities, the public services of the eastern entity are optimized.

Reverol highlighted the advances and early victories for the Neo-Spartan people, which include the delivery of 11 super-cisterns for the complementary drinking water system, the rehabilitation of the treatment plant in El Yaque, the improvements in the Macanao Peninsula Desalination Plant and the continuity of the Comprehensive Lighting Plan for Expressways, on avenues and highways.

## Launched the first Network of the Wildlife Monitoring System in Aragua

**T**he Minister of People's Power for Ecosocialism, Josué Lorca, together with the Governor of the Aragua state, Karina Carpio, and authorities from the national scientific world, launched the First Network of the Wildlife Monitoring System (Motus), in Venezuela (MOTUSVEN ), at the Rancho Grande Biological Station, located in the Henri Pittier National Park.

Motus is an international collaborative research network using coordinated automated radio-sensing, used to facilitate research and education on the ecology and conservation of migratory animals.

Each Motus station is made up of several antennas that can detect the movements of birds that have been tagged with tiny radio transmitters.

After the birds are detected by the antennas, a computer records and sends the signals to a central database, where users can access the data and verify the position in near real time.

# They will recover 300 thousand tables and chairs with national wood

**W**ith the aim of recovering some 300,000 tables and chairs from the campuses, the Ministries of Popular Power for Ecosocialism (Minec), Education and Industries met to refine details on the rehabilitation process of the country's educational centers.

At the meeting was the owner of Minec, Josué Lorca; his counterpart from Education, Yelitze Santaella and a representative from Industries, commissioned by the Vice Presidency of the Republic, with the aim of rehabilitating the furniture in the classrooms, given the proximity of the start of classes.

Yelitze Santaella, in charge of the Education office, indicated that some agreements were analyzed with the Minec, among which the supply of wood and supplies of this material for the repairs of tables and chairs stands out.

"The goal is to recover some 300,000 tables and chairs, a

process in which the communes and teams in the organized territories will participate, for which the Minec has the fundamental task of locating the wood and its derivatives," said Santaella. Also, the meeting discussed the aspect of climate change in relation to the "Brigades against Climate Change" program, promoted and organized by Minec.

"We want to organize brigades in high schools to involve young people who are about to graduate from high school and those who are in their 1st, 2nd and 3rd years in defense of the environment," Santaella stressed.

## Subject Environment

Minister Santaella announced that the intention was discussed to include a subject called Environment in the curriculum of primary and secondary education.

"We want to start working on the issue from the earliest years of life,

so that the boy, the girl and the young person fall in love and take care of everything that has to do with the ecosystem," he said.

He added that he wants to form the brigades in the schools, and that they become school patrollers in the environmental aspect.

## One student, one tree

Likewise, Santaella stated that the Minec has a batch of seeds and together with the Ministry of Education they will develop a pedagogical line, which allows the boy or girl to sow and then in massive days plant the trees, including those who are going to graduate from the high schools.

"It will be a conference that will allow us to reforest and preserve what Venezuela has as heritage, its biodiversity asset," said Minister Santaella.

# The first environmental training workshop is held at the IAIM



Raise awareness about the causes of climate change

**T**he Ministry of People's Power for Ecosocialism (Minec), developed the First Environmental Training Workshop aimed at the servers of the Maiquetía International Airport Institute (IAIM), in an act that was held in the spaces of the "Cruz Felipe Iriarte Auditorium" of the air terminal.

The meeting was prepared to share information on the climate crisis and show how Venezuela can contribute to counteract the negative effects of the atmospheric phenomenon, and continue on the path towards a sustainable future for the next generations.

The moderation of the presentations was in charge of the Vice Minister of Comprehensive Management of the Environment of Minec, Hernán Toro, who pointed out the contribution that the presentations provide to the construction of an ecosocialist Homeland.

"It is a meeting that is based on the Fifth Objective: to conserve the human species and life on the planet, which speaks about the alliances that can be established to achieve this goal and continue protecting the country," he said.

This day began with the dissertation "general perspective of the effects and actions in climate change", directed by Alfredo Guzmán, vice-rector of the Popular University of the Environment Fruto Vivas (UPAFV).

Guzmán highlighted how the environmental crisis corresponds to the progressive deterioration of the functioning of the environmental system, and expressed that "there are people who see the crisis as something negative and others as an opportunity."

On the other hand, he pointed out that the objective of this topic is to sensitize the participants with respect to the causes that generate climate change, and the consequences that may occur due to the fact of not raising awareness about mitigation and adaptation.

The second presentation covered the topic of the comprehensive management of solid waste at airports, led by Roxana Diana, who explained the environmental problems caused by garbage, the impact it generates on the biosphere, the deterioration of the landscape, the generation of leachates, the proliferation of pathogens and the obstruction of water drainage systems.

He also spoke about the Strategic Plan for Comprehensive Garbage Management for Environmental Conservation, designed with nine fundamental axes.

The event ended with a film forum of the cycle corresponding to Climate change, people, planet and life, with the screening of the documentary "Human Ecological Footprint".

## Venezuela participates in CITES 2022

**A** Venezuelan delegation of servers from the Ministry of People's Power for Ecosocialism (Minec), participated in the regional test workshop of the Orientation project of the Convention on International Trade in Endangered Species of Flora and Fauna (CITES for its acronym in English), between September 20 and 21, 2022, which took place in the city of Lima, in Peru.

The event addressed demand reduction strategies to combat illegal trade in species included in the CITES Appendices, which is intended to provide an opportunity for Parties from the Central and South American and Caribbean Region to review the draft of orientation.

This meeting also provides training on how to design and implement demand reduction campaigns, drawing on regional case studies, research insights,

and priorities in the illegal wildlife trade. Additionally, it allows Parties to contribute their views on the potential use of guidance in the region.

CITES should be highlighted, as an international agreement established between governments, with the purpose of ensuring that international trade in specimens of wild animals and plants does not constitute a threat to the survival of species.

This workshop in Spanish, with simultaneous translation into English, was organized by the CITES Management Authority of Peru (National Forestry and Wildlife Service -SERFOR) in collaboration with the Department of Environment, Agriculture and Rural Affairs (Defra) of the United Kingdom. and TRAFFIC.

In addition, it had the contribution of the Wildlife Conservation Society (WCS) through the Alliance for Wildlife and Forests financed by the European Union.

# They project a documentary about the contamination of beaches with plastics

In the continuation of the Cycle of Cineforos "Climate change, people, planet and life", the documentary "Plastic waste: How to stop beach pollution?" was screened, with the purpose of encouraging better control, sustainability and preservation in the coastal areas.

This documentary seeks to highlight the importance of caring for the beaches and their ecosystems, while promoting the awareness of residents and visitors, encouraging them to get involved in cleaning activities that reduce the garbage that causes pollution in coastal areas. In this sense, a polluted beach affects the economy, limits its

recreational, lucrative and aesthetic use, harms animals and degrades the habitat of millions of marine beings. The audiovisual piece emphasizes the microparticles of plastic and garbage ingested by fish and other animals that end up hurt.

David Alvarez, outreach director of the General Directorate of Training for Ecosocialism, pointed out that the material deals with an interview with a colleague in Ecuador, a member of an environmental movement, whose main activity is cleaning and maintaining beaches.

"It is a documentary that reflects how a person from society was concerned about the pollution that exists on the beaches,

promoted a movement that, without having support, gradually grew, constantly maintaining the beaches through a volunteer group," he added.

Likewise, Berlys Pantoja, park ranger of the national headquarters, expressed his pleasure with the film forum, since "awareness is created to maintain the conservation of the environment and the beaches, for being part of the lung of living beings."

# They launch 55 thousand avíos to reforest areas of the Juan Crisóstomo Falcón National Park



Agroecological technique of the Sembrando Vidas program

**T**he Ministry of Popular Power for Ecosocialism (Minec) in Falcón, carried out an aerial planting of 55,000 crops with agroforestry species, in the Juan Crisóstomo Falcón National Park, with the purpose of recovering 6.5 hectares of degraded areas.

The launch of the avios (packages with seeds, nutrients and substrates), is part of the agroecological techniques implemented within the "Sembrando Vida" program, established in the National Reforestation Plan 2022-2023, the container packages of cují seeds were dispersed,

ubeda, vera, dividive, tamarind and cremon, among others.

During the operation, officials from the Minec and its attached entities, the National Parks Institute (Inparques), the Misión Tree Foundation, the National Reforestation Company (Conare), the Environment and Land Management Secretariat (SAOT) of the Falcón state government, participated. in the company of members of the Civil Corps of Park Rangers, Forest Firefighters, along with community volunteers.

205 trees were planted

# Ecourbanism unfolds at the SENAMECF facilities in Cojedes

**A**s part of the National Reforestation Plan 2022-2023, the Ministry of Popular Power for Ecosocialism (Minec), deployed the Eco-urbanism program with the planting of 205 ornamental trees, in the vicinity of the National Service of Medicine and Forensic Sciences (Senamecf) of the Corps of Criminal and Criminalistic Scientific Investigations (Cicpc), in San Carlos, Cojedes state.

Fifty people participated in the operation, including servers from the Ecosocialist Territorial Unit (UTEC) Cojedes, the National Reforestation Company (Conare), the Tree Mission

Foundation, the National Parks Institute (Inparques), the Bolivarian National Guard Environmental Nursery (GNB), and the Fire Department. Foresters of Inparques and Sinamecf of the Cicpc.

For the reforestation in Sinamecf, located in the San Carlos de Austria parish on Bolívar avenue in the municipality of Zamora, 100 specimens of garbancillo, 100 of red tea and five chaguaramos were used.
