Minister Lorca notified President Maduro of records of torrential rains in Las Tejerías

The Minister of People's Power for Ecosocialism, Josué Lorca, notified the President of the Bolivarian Republic of Venezuela, Nicolás Maduro Moros, of the records of torrential rain events that occurred in the past in the Las Tejerías sector of Aragua state.

"Yesterday Civil Protection (PC), provided us with a history of the latest events that occurred in the Los Patos stream, and the oldest appears to be one of October 12, 1989 with an incidence in the

El Béisbol sector, a flood that caused the affectation of five houses and five families", said Lorca.

In addition, he pointed out that the closest climatic event was a trough in 2010 that impacted the La Arenera, El Béisbol and Antonio José de Sucre sectors, with floods and that left an average balance of 700 affected homes.

Minister Lorca's statements were made during a presidential working day from the Miraflores Palace Command Post.

Execute adaptation processes in vulnerable regions

Venezuela develops plans to address the climate crisis



They assist and train the people to face climate variability scenarios

The Venezuelan State addresses the aspects of mitigation, adaptation and monitoring as part of the plans to address the climate crisis.

This was reported by the director of the National Climate Crisis Observatory (ONCC), Franklin Leal, during his participation in the program *Café en la Mañana*, which is broadcast by Venezolana de Televisión (VTV).

"Mitigation corresponds to the measures that are adopted to avoid gas emissions and contamination of the planet, adaptation as processes that are activated to adapt to the phenomena that may occur in short and long periods and monitoring, which is to be aware of the emissions that are thrown into the atmosphere and all the activities that are carried out," he said.

He assured that in Venezuela, thanks to the policies of President Nicolás Maduro and in his case under the guidance of Minister Josué Lorca, "we are establishing guidelines that allow adaptation processes to be carried out, especially in regions that are vulnerable.

"The climate crisis is a global thing. We are being affected as human beings, vegetation and all living beings are impacted by a change that is taking place thanks to anthropic activity (of humans), especially gas pollution, because the emission affects the global climate", held.

He added that the geographical location of Venezuela has some special characteristics because it has the Caribbean Sea to the north, which is part of the Atlantic Ocean. "When it heats up, this large mass of water is transformed into volumes of steam that represent water in the air and it has to precipitate, with higher precipitations, than normal," he clarified.

He also highlighted that the Andes Mountains have seen a large number of events that have taken place, "because there is a concentration of water in Lake Maracaibo, which heats up more intensely than the Caribbean Sea, because the water is locked up and the rains are seen more often".

"When the President ordered the creation of the Observatory, he did not conceive it as climate change so that it would be directly technical, but the climate crisis, because they are not only climatic phenomena, there is also a society involved, which at different times has to be addressed. , educate and train her, to face these new scenarios that climate variability presents us with", she commented.

He also pointed out that there is a whole dynamic in the world with the climate issue, "to study it, because we have to teach it to all our people, communities, people, street bosses, who need to be empowered about the climate crisis."

The representatives of this Asian company envision that the waste can be used in homes, squares and places where the population can take advantage of it.

The company's proposal is innovative, because it would help the country in terms of the use of garbage from collection to its transformation into new products.

Visit to La Bonanza and Las Mayas

On October 14, Minister Lorca

together with the Chinese company Beijing Huanengda Power Technology Application Co. visited the La Bonanza sanitary landfills in the state of Miranda and Las Mayas in the Capital District, to carry out an evaluation of the potentiality of the land based on the amount of garbage and its various elements for the possible installation of a building products plant (blocks).

"This innovative proposal would represent a solution to a tangible problem in the area of public services, in this case solid waste, because it would deconcentrate the amount of garbage that goes to final disposal sites," Lorca said through the social network Instagram.

Deployment of the Special Plan for Solid Waste Collection and Cleaning begins in Caracas



Plan will have more than 400 sweepers in Caracas

The Special Plan for the Collection of Solid Waste and Cleaning of Caracas, which is called "The New Face of Conscience", began this week from the Poliedro de Caracas.

During the launch of the program, the mayor of the Bolivarian Libertador municipality, A/J Carmen Meléndez, stressed that "this is done to strengthen the collection of waste throughout Caracas. Here we are all the institutions, the Municipal Services Corporation and all the entities, because there is going to be a person in charge in each street, to keep the entire city clean".

Likewise, he thanked the Ministry of People's Power for Ecosocialism for providing containers to keep the capital city clean, highlighting that these have also favored the communities of Caracas.

He assured that more than 400 sweepers will participate in this deployment.

For his part, the Minister of Ecosocialism, Josué Lorca, indicated that "these men and women are going to go out to every street and avenue, to raise awareness and work with the people of Caracas to continue strengthening the construction of a new ecosocial model between the people, the Armed Forces, the police force and each one of the Government entities".

It should be noted that this Wednesday, Mayor Carmen Meléndez reported that her office established new agreements with private companies that are in charge of the waste collection service, to improve the work and enhance the well-being of the people of Caracas and visitors.

They will create a Work Committee Permanent Commission of Ecosocialism of the AN revises the Criminal Law of the Environmente

The Permanent Commission of Ecosocialism of the National Assembly (AN), began the review of the current Penal Law of the Environment in force since May 2012.

The review of the 110 articles was made, where the president of the Commission, deputy Ricardo Molina, proposed to create a working committee made up

of different sectors, to evaluate the articles and prepare a proposal to modify the current law.

Molina stressed that currently in the country there is a level of organization in the Congress of the New Era Ecosocialist, Ecologist and Environmentalist sector, and from there a work route will be proposed to consult the Venezuelan people on the subject.

Parra expressed surprise because in the past period the student data of this House of Studies reached 615 students, while for the current period at least 1,600

With an eco-workshop they address "Myths and Truths" of some animals to guarantee their protection

The Ministry of Popular Power for Ecosocialism (Minec), through the General Directorate of Training, developed a discussion on "Myths and truths" of certain animals such as bats, black cats, spiders, owls, wolves and snakes.

The activity is part of the cycle of "Eco-workshops" that it carries out together with the Ombudsman's Office (DP), with the purpose of seeking moderation in the conduct of people with respect to these animals.

The Special Delegate Defender with National Competence in Environmental Matters of the DP, Xiomara Cuevas, was in charge of the dissertation, accompanied by members of the Nevado Mission.

The Director of Dissemination of the MINEC Training Directorate, David Álvarez, indicated that "certain

animals are mistreated, marginalized or forgotten", for which he considers that they deserve protection from the population and not rejection due to the fear that has been generated by the superstition

"We make a call to conscience to overcome the rights of animals over superstitions, beliefs and myths," he said.
