Venezuela firm in the preservation and conservation of World Heritage

Between December 5 and 9, in the city of Kazan, Russia, the International Forum dedicated to the 50th Anniversary of the World Heritage Convention was held, an event organized by the Government of the Russian Federation in conjunction with the Russian National Commission for Cooperation with the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO).

Venezuela, in the voice of Minister Lorca, conveyed a message of peace, friendship and solidarity, while congratulating Russia's initiative to hold this Forum.

Heritage Guarantee

Minister Lorca reiterated Venezuela's commitment to the preservation and conservation of the World Heritage found in the national territory, despite the multiple coercive measures to which it has been subjected and which unfortunately affect the exercise of cultural rights by the village.

In the same way, he pointed out that the Bolivarian Republic of Venezuela is committed to the protection of its three sites

declared as World Heritage Sites: the University City of Caracas, the Canaima National Park and the city of Coro, including its Port of La Vela.

During his participation in the panel dedicated to the Safeguarding of Natural Heritage, Lorca highlighted the actions undertaken by the Venezuelan State for the protection of the Canaima National Park, among which he highlighted the significant increase in the number of Civil Park Rangers, Community Brigade members Indigenous and Forest Firefighters.

He denounced that in recent years it has been observed that the sites declared as Heritage have become the object of attack, in the context of the multiform war, as well as the interference by NGOs that seek to discredit the work of safeguarding our heritage sites.

Countries from Africa, Asia, Europe and Latin America participated to share experiences in the restoration, protection and safeguarding of the Cultural and Natural Heritage of Humanity.

Restores architectural values

Venezuela executes actions for the welfare of Cultural Heritage

In the panel dedicated to the management of Cultural Heritage during the 50th Anniversary of the World Heritage Convention, Jacqueline Faría, president of the Venezuela Bella Mission, presented the progress of the work carried out in the University City of Caracas by the Presidential Commission for the Recovery of the UCV, as a response of the Venezuelan State, in the maintenance of this emblematic heritage.

Faría announced the methodology used and the techniques used for the recovery of the site, which have been carried out with heritage preservation criteria, restoring the architectural,

landscape and artistic values of the original project of architect Carlos Raúl Villanueva, considered by UNESCO for its inscription on the World Heritage list as an exponent of modern architecture in Latin America.

Finally, anthropologist Dinorah Cruz, president of the Cultural Heritage Institute, shared the experience in Coro and its Puerto de La Vela, in terms of restoration and preservation of traditional construction techniques, highlighting the importance of the "Chucho" Heritage Cuadrilla. García" and the work of the master craftsmen to preserve the original mixture with clay, managing to maintain the combination of indigenous, Spanish and Dutch architectural elements, which

is sought to be transmitted to future generations as a World Heritage legacy.



Traditional construction techniques prevail

After three years of trying

Lion is born in the Caricuao Zoological Park

Authorities of the Caricuao Zoological Park, an entity attached to the Ministry of People's Power for Ecosocialism (Minec), announced that after three years of attempts, last Monday at 11:00 p.m. and 10:00 p.m., the lioness Kuma, staying in the place, had a puppy that is observed in good condition.

The little one is a descendant of the male Atila, who along with Kuma, have been in Caricuao since 2012, when they were retained from wildlife traffickers and could not be returned to their natural habitat.

The zoo spokesmen indicated that the couple of cats are 10 years old

and since 2005 there had been no successful births in captivity in the country.

Kuma has shown good maternal skills with the calf and is kept under 24-hour observation, through a video surveillance system installed in the animal's housing.

Under normal conditions, a pregnant lioness, after about 110 days of gestation, can give birth to between one and four cubs.

The birth is the result of the determined action of the Bolivarian Government to create the best conditions for the species in the exhibition centers, thereby strengthening zoos as wildlife

rescue areas, as well as becoming pedagogical spaces for the construction of the Ecosocialism.

Among the activities, there was a display of children from the "Ing. Ricardo Gondelles" preschool, dependent on Minec, who cheered up with a Christmas party that delighted the authorities, Minec workers, and representatives of the brigades.

"The party of the preschoolers was beautiful, as well as the words of some brigade members and those corresponding to the devotion to our Lord Jesus Christ and to God, the creator of everything, of essence", said Román.

He pointed out that it seeks to deepen the message of saving life on the planet and the human species.

As part of the activities commemorating the first anniversary of the Brigades Against Climate Change, a National Meeting of Coordinators was held.

The meeting was attended by the president of the National Foundation for Environmental Education (Fundambiente) and General Director of Training at Minec, Jesús Méndez, the Director of Training at the Headquarters of the National Institute of Parks (Inparques), Magaly Alviar, the director of the National Observatory of the Climate Crisis (ONCC), Franklin Leal, the National Coordinator of the brigades, Jean Carlos Román, the general of the Inparques Forest Firefighters, Germán Gutiérrez and national head of the Civil Park Rangers of Inparques, Pablo Lira.

In this regard, the President of Fundambiente and Director of Training at Minec, Jesús Méndez, stated that he was very happy to participate in the events for the institution's first anniversary.

"It has been a policy instructed by President Nicolás Maduro and Minister Josué Lorca. It is a group of young people, a very active force that carries out fundamental tasks in the country, in terms of adaptation, mitigation, agitation and mobilization against the climate crisis", he pointed.

He assured that reflections were made "with colleagues, state coordinators and national teams. Today we have reviewed the results in terms of training, dissemination and research in this 2022".

"Also, we review the tasks for the year 2023. It will be a process of much battle and fight against the climate crisis. The agenda will be very busy and for this the Brigades Against Climate Change will have a leading and leading role", he said.

For her part, the Inparques Training Director, Magaly Alviar, stated that "a wonderful, dynamic and attractive workshop was held for the country's youth".

"It was possible to make known what Inparques' mission and vision are, what are the main characteristics of our fragile ecosystems, why take care of the planet and how to save it", he said.

He added that "ecotourism was linked to the function of saving the planet, because sometimes we do mass tourism that affects Mother Earth. It is a day of environmental awareness for all brigade members against climate change".

Directors receive training on the National Integrated Forest Information System

In order to update knowledge on the new instrument, the Ministry of Popular Power for Ecosocialism (Minec) and technical representatives of the United Nations Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO) in Venezuela, held a workshop on the National System Integrated Forest Information (Siniif).

The induction was addressed to the staff of the General Directorate of Forest Heritage of Minec and to the directors of 17 states, who were connected through the Zoom videoconference platform.

In this regard, the general director of Forest Heritage of Minec, Zoraima Echenique, indicated that the course will serve as a tool for the "collection, systematization and processing of existing data on the evaluation and periodic monitoring of forests from different perspectives".

"One of the most important is the ecosocial aspect: the behavior of our species within our indigenous communities", he said.

He added that the system is "important because it seeks to integrate the conservation of our diversity, forest masses and help in forest management and climate change mitigation."

"It is a tool for decision-making in government matters regarding forests", he said.

For his part, Jesús Cegarra, technical coordinator of the FAO Sustainable Forest Management and Forest Conservation Project, representing the person in charge of the organization in Venezuela, Alexis Bonte, commented that an execution phase is being carried out between Minec and FAO as implementer.

"Today the start-up workshop of the Siniif began, a training that is given in this first stage to all the general directors involved in the substantive directions, related to information management", he said.

He said that the Siniif is essential for the management of cartography, ecosystem data, forest species and everything that has to do with environmental information that is generated and managed by Minec.

"It is of great value, since it will allow, quickly and summarized, to have all the information validated by the Ministry, in order to present it to the country and the world, what is the status and conditions of the environment in Venezuela", held.

He added that with the Siniif "we can recover on social networks the positioning of the extraordinary work that is done in Venezuela in environmental matters".

Businessmen importing gases with global warming potential receive comprehensive training

To update and recall the import procedures, the Ministry of People's Power for Ecosocialism (Minec) met with representatives of companies that import gases that have global warming potential.

The meeting was led by the General Director of Environmental Quality of Minec, José García, who pointed out that the meeting was held with a workshop called "Administrative and technical control mechanisms for the importation of refrigerant gases with global warming potential".

"The meeting is in context with the policies of the Government and the environmental rights established in the Constitution and in the Fifth Historical Objective of the Plan for the Homeland 2019-2025, which indicates the contribution to the preservation of life on the planet and the salvation of the human species", he said.

He affirmed that the businessmen received mechanisms on how they should import, they also participated in "a talk to raise awareness regarding the indiscriminate use of substances that affect our planet and cause global warming".

"We are happy because in 2019 Venezuela signed the Kigali Amendment and yesterday in New York the instrument of deposit of the agreement was made, of which the Venezuelan State is a full member", he recalled.

García commented that with the deposit instrument of the Kigali Amendment the contribution of "interesting resources will be achieved so that entities such as MINEC obtain financing for the acquisition of equipment and the training of personnel".
